HOA General Meeting:

Pandemic, COLA hikes lead to dues increase

'Right on target' budget needs help with reserve

espite unanticipated expenses from the Covid-19 pandemic, the 2020 Spring Knolls budget is "right on target," board vice president Cyndy May told several dozen residents at the Oct. 17 General meeting.

Cyndy also reported, however, that to meet cost-of-living (COLA) hikes and state requirements for a prudent reserve account, a \$10-

per-month dues increase will be assessed starting Jan. 1.

She noted that it will be the first dues hike since 2014, and mirrors actual cost-of-living increases over the same period. Annual dues will rise from \$900 to \$1,020. Dues paid in two installments will be \$510 every six months.

2021 Budget summary:

- 2021 dues hike of \$10 / month to achieve \$80,000 reserve, and avoid a deficit and assessments.
- First dues hike since 2014.
- Projected income after expenses: \$13,635.
- Landscaping water savings awaits plant rooting, rainfall.

Last January, before the pandemic, Cyndy warned residents that a slight dues increase was likely in 2021 due to rising costs and a need to bolster the reserve.

On Oct. 17, she said unanticipated costs stemming from the pandemic, as well as yet-to-be realized water expense savings from the landscaping project have both contributed to the dues hike need. Water cost savings should increase once new plants have established themselves and if hoped-for rainfall arrives, she added.

She said that the HOA's reserve account, required by state law to cover major emergency expenses, is in the "fair," or middle range of what is actually needed.

"While 'Fair' is OK – it will quickly lapse into the 'Weak' category if we don't increase our Reserve Account funds," Cyndy added.

Cyndy explained that \$80,000 will make up the reserve account -- \$20,000 more than usual -- in order to avoid a deficit and possible special assessments. The additional funds barely cover one year of street paving costs..

In addition to Cyndy's report, Nominating Committee chairperson Jan Tower introduced four candidates for the 2021 board: Betty Dutton, Sandra Pride, Maggie Underwood and Sandy Vollmer.

Nominations from the floor and a final closing of nominations were deferred until the board's Oct. 28 meeting in the back patio beginning at 9:30 a.m. It is open to all residents. It can also be attended through ZOOM.

Health'nSafety

Spring Knolls Covid – 19 update*:

(as of Oct. 26).

On Oct. 20, Riverside County moved back into the most restrictive "purple" tier from the less restrictive red due to increases in Covid-19 levels.

The new classification will mean that Spring Knolls' rules affecting certain amenities, meetings and events will continue until further notice.

The county's re-designation will remain in effect at least until Nov. 10. As a result many businesses and public facilities may not meet indoors or may do so only with certain limitations.

The reclassification came less than a month after Riverside County had moved into the "red" tier from purple after briefly showing improvements in its Covid 19 levels.

During the red tier period various personal care services, movie theaters, museums, places of worship, gyms and restaurants were allowed to open legally with modifications.

Spring Knolls' guidelines:

Masks and social distancing required at all times on clubhouse grounds. Only residents permitted; no exceptions. Violators face fines and/or suspension of privileges or fob use.

Open: Until Nov. 1, both pools, restrooms, Wednesday — Sunday. Residents ONLY; no children. The small pool will be closed for winter effective Nov. 1. Large pool remains open.

- Closed: Until further notice: Office, gym, library, billiard room, showers, Jacuzzi.
- Board meetings: Held outside or through ZOOM, with no limits on numbers. Masks, social distancing required.
- Gates: Center gate accessible by fob. All gates closed Mondays and Tuesdays.
- Canceled: Bingo, Aqua-cise, card room, prayer group.

It's getting darker, so watch your steps

The holiday period also coincides with the shortest numbers of hours of daylight. So, please be extra careful when outdoors.

Whether you're walking, driving a cart or car, or if you're going to have visitors, please warn yourself and others about dangers faced in the dark.

Tell your visitors that many people walk the streets with or without pets and that the speed limit is 20 mph. Beginning at dusk, walkers should wear light or white clothing, preferably with reflective tape for both yourselves and your pets.

KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOR: Jim Witt

For 30 years, bowling was right up his alley

im Witt served in the U.S. Marine Corps during the Korean War but that wasn't his first life -threatening encounter.

Years earlier, in a back alley in New Ulm. Minnesota, he was in a different combat zone of sorts.

New Ulm's aging six-lane bowling alley, built in the 1800s, was the place. In high school at the time, Jim was a pin setter, several years before that task became mostly automated across the country.

It was Jim's job to reset bowling pins on the pin decks at the end of each frame, clear those hit during mid frames and return bowling balls.

He liked his job, but one night a local guy began throwing his bowling ball so hard down Jim's assigned alley that he had to dive out of the way of the flying pins. Jim was spared of any injury, so to speak, but the bowler was thrown out.

That narrow escape didn't scare young Jim Witt from the winter sport his family loved. In fact, he said he became so proficient he eventually could scoop up six pins at once for resetting.

And, after high school, two years at North Dakota State, and three years in the Marines, Jim returned to New Ulm and, in his late 20s, teamed up with his parents and brother-in-law and bought the very lanes where it all began.

After operating his first bowling alley, Jim and his partners moved the equipment and lanes from the original site to a new one. Later, they bought two more alleys and he would operate them for 30 years before moving on to other pursuits. Jim said he was so done with bowling

when he closed his last lanes that he used his leftover pins for firewood.

One new pursuit was a 12-cabin summer camp, Norway Beach Resort on Minnesota's Cass Lake, about 150 miles northwest of Minneapolis. There, Jim and his wife Betty ran a

small general store, a fish house and rented out boats and the cabins.

They worked hard for two years, selling leeches and other bait, using a wringer washer to clean towels and bedding for their guests and keeping up the grounds. One thing they never expected was a tornado, which whipped through the area one summer, scattering their rental boats around Cass Lake. Guess who had to recover them?

Both Jim and Betty say that some of their fondest memories are of Norway Beach Resort, despite all the work. And, despite the tornado!

Speaking of Betty, their romance began as high school sophomores, years before they were married in 1953. In October, they celebrated their 67th anniversary.

The Witts have five children: — Daniel (Temecula), Bradley (El Cajon) and Julie (Escondido). Son Paul lives in Fort Collins, CO, and daughter Becky in Charlotte, NC. They also have 10 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

After a decade as a real estate appraiser, Jim and Betty moved to Spring Knolls in 1998 to be near their California family.

It wasn't long after moving to Spring Knolls that Jim became active. For 16 years, Jim wasn't exactly dodging flying bowling pins, but in some cases the challenges he faced rivaled those days in New Ulm.

From 2002 through 2018 Jim served eight two-year terms on the Spring Knolls board as Unit I's Architectural Director, considering countless permit applications from Unit 1 residents.

In case you were wondering, there's no truth to rumors that over the years he turned down numerous requests to install private bowling alleys in the backyards of several homes.

Right, Jim?

HOA BOARD MEETING: Anyone interested in running for the HOA board should attend the Oct. 28 meeting in the patio area behind Eaker Hall. The meeting begins at 9:30 a.m. and will include the nomination of candidates from the floor. Candidates must be physically present or present through ZOOM to be considered. This action was taken due to a lack of a quorum of residents at the Oct. 17 meeting.

ELECTIONS: Candidate profiles and ballots for the HOA board election will be mailed to all Spring Knolls homeowners in late November or early December. Each household is entitled to one vote. Winners will be announced during the January meeting.

POOL CLOSING: The small pool at the clubhouse facility will be closed for the winter beginning Nov. 1. The large pool will remain available and remain restricted to four people at a time. See Health'nSafety, Page 3.

HANDYPERSON OR CONTRACTING

WORK? It's OK, but use of any noisy machinery such as power saws, drills, lawnmowers, or leaf blowers is permitted only between 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on weekdays and from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on weekends and holidays.

PROPERTY CLEAN UP, CLEAN OUT: Board approval is needed if you wish to have a large refuse or storage container brought to your property. The permit will allow the storage for up to a week. If a container is on the street, it must have reflectors facing oncoming traffic. Traffic cones and barricades are available from the association office to increase safety.

DON'T LEAVE THE LEAVES: If you're looking for something to do with that extra hour on

Nov. 1, instead of sleeping, consider raking or sweeping up any leaves in your yard or along the curb. We don't have street sweepers, so that little tidiness is up to you. *Sorry*.



APPEALS: Any property owner may appeal any Board of Directors or board committee action. Just submit a written request for a hearing before the board within 10 days of receiving a letter indicating that an action will be taken or has been taken. The board decision following a hearing is final. Appeals are not permitted for failure to pay regular assessments or any other assessments.


