To our stragglers: Compliance isn't optional



Believe it or not, many stragglers in our monthslong efforts to collect the <u>re-</u>

quired OWNER/RESIDENT forms for Spring Knolls are keeping the association waiting while they receive monthly fines for noncompliance.

To those of you who turned them in January when they were due, the association thanks you.

Those still delinquent are being fined at a rate of \$50 per month as a late fee. Some stragglers now owe hundreds of dollars in penalties, which continue to mount. All tardy residents have received specific deadlines and many reminders that these forms must be

filled out EVERY YEAR.

If you lost the form don't panic,



you merely need to tell us and we'll supply a new one. Come to the office on any Friday between 9:30 a.m. to noon

and we'll instantly supply a new form. We'll even help you fill it out. What could be easier? That won't erase penalties, but it surely will keep them from growing.

The Board set the \$50 per month fine because the State of California requires these forms every year. And, besides the monthly penalty, continued noncompliance may also lead to inactivation of your key fob to the clubhouse and pool areas until the form is turned in and the penalties paid.

None of the Spring Knolls volunteers benefit from these fines, and they wish that messages like this were unnecessary. Also, no board member wants to spend their volunteer hours tracking your delinquent accounts, preparing and mailing out fine notices and making phone calls to you about



something that should have been taken care of last January.

To those who are very late, won't you please help yourselves and get your forms in

immediately? Thank you!!!

READ CAREFULLY: IMPORTANT INFO FOR EVERYONE!

All <u>Unit 1 residents</u>, and *only* Unit 1 residents, have been issued key fobs for our Clubhouse gates. Residents living in Units 2 have key fobs for the Unit 2 gate

and Unit 3 residents have key fobs for their gate. Your Clubhouse privileges extend only to



the unit neighborhood you live in (1, 2 or 3).

How to get a fob key ...

If you don't have a fob, or you have an older one, you need to come to the office from 9:30 a.m. to noon any Friday to exchange your old fob for a new one. (A current key fob is pictured above.)

If you can't get a fob be-

LOOKING FOR LOOMETHINGS cause your privileges have been revoked, you must rectify the issues before your fob privileges are reinstated.

There are doorbells at the gates which will notify the caretaker and she will address your concerns and let you in if appropriate.

Forgotten your fob?

If you've forgotten your fob as happens to many of us, please <u>DO NOT</u> stand at the gates and shout or rattle them so someone will let you inside. It is not the job of those enjoying the pools or any other facility to let you access the clubhouse area or to check if you're a Unit 1 resident. The best solution is to return home to get your fob.

And, for those enjoying the pools, while we know you're

trying to be helpful, you should <u>NOT</u> let people in the gates who you don't know. And why? Because if <u>you</u> let someone in, <u>you're ultimately responsible for any damages or accidents that may occur</u> as a result. If something does happen, under HOA rules, you can lose your clubhouse entry privileges as well.

Rule breakers ...

As you may have guessed by now, recently there have been rule breakers. Residents from other units and outsiders have inappropriately accessed our pools and problems have occurred.

Spring Knolls Community Library


The King of the Westerns is here!
